This report summarizes the activities of Human Resources during the month of May 2020.

In March the Commission had 51 FTE positions available. We have 1 part-time employee.

- New Hires: We postponed bringing in the 3 summer legal interns until June 1.
- Separations or Retirements: None
- Leaves: None

I met with management several times on a couple of employee-related issues and we have begun addressing the issues.

We sent 18 "All Agency" emails during the month.

In SCEIS, I had 8 SCEIS transactions. Payroll and time reports were run as scheduled. We processed no travel in the month of May.

We had 1 CBRE building issues and no parking issues.

Since March 23<sup>rd</sup>, I have been reporting to the State HR department data regarding who was working onsite, telecommuting, and taking leave. This is done daily.

Many hours have been spent on preparing for re-entry into the office. Policies were established, memos were sent to all employees regarding the return to work and more are ready to be sent at the appropriate time. PPE was purchased, tote bags with PPE and other items for the Commissioners' use were distribute and signage was installed.

Our EEOC report was completed and submitted as request.

I continued to track employees work activities from home. Once a week, I receive lists of the daily activities of those working from home. I take that data, summarize daily activities into a weekly summary by employee and add it to a spreadsheet for management's review.

For the month of May, we had an average of 13 employees working onsite, 36 employees working from home and average of 2 employees taking leave.

This report summarizes the activities and accomplishments of departmental projects and initiatives for the IT department during June 2020.

#### I. Systems Operations, Maintenance and Support

#### **EDI**

We are continuing to convert all EDI trading partner accounts to a new server with enhanced security. The team worked with multiple EDI Trading Partners identify specific reasons for data rejections on Claims and POC submissions. We continue our participation in IAIABC conference calls for Jurisdictions Only and for EDI Claims Committee. Our team has made significant contributions to the IAIABC's XML QA and POC 3.0 XML Taskforces. Their efforts have been recognized by the staff at the IA and they are commended for their efforts.

#### **Progress**

Duane resolved multiple errors with Payment/Invoice entries and Bank Deposit records. He identified the source of printing issues on the Hearing Notices and cleaned up data to resolve the issues. He modified the Progress JAR Display program to display additional Order information; the Appeal Notice programs and Form 31 template were both modified to accommodate virtual Appeal Hearings as requested. Liz generated 140 X-files for this month and continued her work to map the new DEW data into our current interface.

#### **Systems Support**

During June, Jason's efforts remain focused on supporting staff and building efficiencies in our work from home processes. We continue to use Zoom and CourtCall effectively and have sustained continuity of our business operations. We are also moderating the virtual Appellate Hearings for the agency. We are developing a plan to replace our aging hardware, including laptops, iPads and cell phones. We configured 3 of our last 5 laptops for our 3 new lawclerks.

#### Reporting

The InfoSec Security report was completed and submitted to the Department of Information Security. All preliminary fiscal year-end reports were run and provided to the department heads for review. We added the COVID report to our monthly reporting schedule. We developed a new report for Claims r0065 to report outstanding carrier fines. Additionally, we generated several Open Claims reports for external stakeholders and provided Compliance reports for

internal staff. We began work on the annual asset audit and inventory process as part of the IT Data Collection and Planning report to the Department of Administration.

#### **OnBase**

In our testing for the upcoming OnBase version, several issues were identified. Kim is working with DTO to ensure these obstacles are resolved and client upgrade process is as efficient as possible with minimal impact to our users.

#### Hardware

Our standard 3-year laptop refresh lifecycle has begun, and we are evaluating laptops from all state contract vendors.

#### II. Projects, Enhancements and Development

#### Legacy Modernization

We continue our working engagement with Microsoft as part of the gap analysis of our KERMIT project. The full KERMIT team observed ICAP's demo to Microsoft and the subsequent Microsoft/ICAP Technical meeting. Microsoft expects it will take several more weeks to complete their Gap Analysis.

#### **Security Training**

All staff must complete the annual security training this month. The training was released on July 10<sup>th</sup> and is being provided through SCEIS; our agency's deadline for 100% participation is August 10, 2020.

Commissioners can provide concerning our performance and direction.

In June 2020, 10 compliance files were created from the combined filings of Form 50's, 12A's, and stakeholder reporting involving uninsured employers.


YTD vs. Prior Year total (245): 103% June 2020 to June 2019: 56% Current Yr End trend: 103% of 2018-2019


YTD 2019-2020 v. YTD 2018-2019: 95%

In June 2020, 140 compliance files were generated from the DEW data process.


YTD vs. Prior Year total (1,749): 51% June 2020 to June 2019: 87% Current Yr End trend: 51% of 2018-2019

The Compliance Division closed June 2020 with 253 cases active, compared to an active caseload of 528 at the close of June 2019.




For the month of June 2020, Compliance Division staff closed-out 121 cases.


#### **Compliance Fines:**

In June 2020, the Compliance Division collected \$68,187 in fines and penalties. Year to Date, the Compliance Division has collected \$1,072,940 in fines and penalties.





#### **WCC Claim Files:**

In June 2020, the Coverage Division received a total of 1,983 WCC Claim files. Of these, 1,718 were created through proper carrier filing of a 12A, and 265 were generated as a result of a Form 50 claim filing. Year to Date 25,138 Claim files have been created which is 103% of claim file volume prior year (24,289).

#### **Coverage Fines:**

The Coverage Division collected \$19,550 in fine revenue in June 2020, as compared to \$23,150 in Coverage fines/penalties accrued during June 2019. Year on Year, Coverage fines are at 55% of collections for prior year.







#### IMS SELF INSURANCE DIVISION

- \* conducted 4 Self Insurance audits.


Year to Date, Self Insurance tax revenue is trending at 93% of prior year and 48 Self Insurance audits have been completed.

## Employer Rule to Show Cause Hearings and Compliance Activity




#### **Employers Obtaining Coverage**



Although the Division has assessed \$6.4 m in fines this fiscal year, \$6.1 m have been waived or rescinded as employers have either obtained insurance coverage or were found not to be subject to the Act.








#### **Carrier Rule to Show Cause Hearings**

The Compliance Division manages the Rule to Show Cause process involving the recovery of outstanding carrier fines and penalties. In the month of June 2020, 27 carrier RTSC cases were docketed; 27 cases were resolved for a total of \$8,579.

Year to date, a total of 165 carrier RTSC cases have been docketed, 163 cases for a total of \$70,525 have been resolved.

**Monthly Judicial Report for June 2020** 

During the month of June, the Judicial Department processed eight hundred eightynine (889) requests for hearings, one hundred forty-eight (148) Motions and one hundred fifty-four (154) clincher conference requests that were sent to the Jurisdictional Commissioners.

There were one hundred five (105) Single Commissioner Hearings conducted during the past month, forty-five (45) pre-hearing conferences held and ten (10) Full Commission hearings held. A total of four hundred ninety-five (495) Orders were served at the single Commissioner level, thirty-nine (39) of those were Decision and Orders that resulted from hearings that went on the record and one hundred sixty-one (161) were Motion Orders that were a result of Motions ruled upon by Commissioners.

The Informal Conference system conducted two hundred twenty-five (225) hearings during the last month.


There were twenty-two (22) regulatory mediations scheduled and eighty (80) requested mediations. The Judicial Department was notified of sixty-eight (68) matters resolved in mediation, with the receipt of Forms 70.

In the month of May, Judicial received one (1) Notice of Intent to Appeal to the Court of Appeals and zero (0) to the Circuit Court.



#### Preparation of Return to Work

Effective June 15, the Department of Administration initiated Phase 2 of the re-entry to work program. The primary focus of the phase was for state agencies to open to the public following the recommended CDC guidelines for safe practices. The Commission opened to the public on June 15. The safety of our employees is a primary factor in the decision. Safety protocols recommended by the CDC and DHEC have been implemented for having members of the public in the office and interacting with employees. The Department of Administration allowed the agencies to determine if employees were able to continue working from home to allow the agency to accomplish its mission. We have continuously monitored the production of work by staff since the employees began working from home. The current system is maintaining a sustainable level of work to provide the services to accomplish our mission. With the COVID 19 numbers increasing we decided to maintain the current work from home program and monitoring the production levels until further directions are provided by the Department of Administration, DHEC and the CDC in preparing for Phase 3. I would like to commend the employees who have been working on site daily. Without their efforts the employees working from home would not be able to complete their tasks. They were critical to our continuing to provide the level of services to our constituents.

#### Meetings/Activities

From June 3, 2020 to July 14, 2020 the Executive Director spent the majority of the time working from home. He participated in 13 Zoom conference calls and webinars.

#### Constituent / Public Information Services

For the period June 3, 2020 to July 14, 2020, the Executive Director's Office and the General Counsel's office had 345 electronic and personal contacts with claimants or constituents, state agencies, federal agencies, attorneys, service providers, business partners; and letters with congressional offices.

#### **Financial Transactions Activity**

For the period June 3, 2020 to July 14, 2020 the Director's office processed and approved 18 travel expense reports, 53 invoices, and 52 deposits for DOA to process in the SCIES system.

#### SCWCC Stakeholder Electronic Distribution List

For the period June 3, 20202 through July 14, 2020 we added one (1) individual. Due to the receipt of email delivery failures, a total of five (5) email addresses were deleted. A total of 785 individuals currently receive notifications from the Commission.

#### **Advisory Notices**

Since the last Business Meeting our office prepared 2 Advisory and other Notices for stakeholders. They were posted on the Commission's website and emailed to the distribution list.

FINANCIAL REPORT - Period ending June 30, 2020

Attached is the Budget vs. Actual Report for the General Fund and Earmarked Fund for the fiscal year period ending June 30, 2020. The benchmark for this period is 100%. Final adjustments will be made during the process of closing the books for FY20. I anticipate providing the adjusted final financial report at the August Business Meeting.

#### **Expenditures**

The expenditures for the General Fund are on pages 1-3. The year-to-day expenditures in the General Fund (10010000) for this period is \$2.6 million or 56% of budget.

The Earmarked Fund financials may be found on pages 4-10 of the "Budget vs. Actual Report FY2020. The year-to-date expenditures for the Earmarked Fund (38440000) are \$4.4 million or 79% of budget. The fund has \$214,859 of Commitments.

#### Revenues

The Earmarked Fund received \$2.6 million in Operating Revenues through June 30, 2020. This is 93% of budget. As noted last month the Training Conference Registration Fee (438002000) received is 23% more than the budgeted amount as a result of the six regional training sessions conducted last fall on KERMIT. The amount received in the Sale of Listing and Labels (448006000) account is substantially over the budgeted amount, which is most likely a coding error when the funds were deposited. We will make the appropriate transfer before the end of the fiscal year.

To date we have received \$4.6 million Self-Insurance Tax funds.
